MRI CERVICAL SPINE

Summary:

1. Severe bilateral C6-7 foraminal stenoses for the emerging C7 nerves.
2. Severe left and moderate to severe right C5-6 foraminal stenoses for the emerging C6 nerves.
3. Severe bilateral C3-4 foraminal stenoses for the emerging C4 nerves.

Clinical:

Right and now left ? C7/8 radiculopathy, mainly left shoulder/ neck pain. Pins and needles hand. FI.

Technique:

Routine MRI cervical spine.

Comparison Study:

Not available.

Findings:

No fracture or concerning bone lesion. The visualised brain and cord are within limits. No paraspinal mass.

C2-3: No canal or foraminal stenosis.

C3-4: Posterior disc bulge and uncovertebral disc osteophyte complex. Mild left facet arthrosis. Severe bilateral foraminal stenoses. Mild canal stenosis.

C4-5: Minor annular disc laxity and small right uncovertebral disc osteophyte complex. Mild right foraminal stenosis. No canal or significant left foraminal stenosis. Minimal facet arthrosis.

C5-6: Posterior and uncovertebral disc osteophyte complexes. Facets intact. No significant canal stenosis. Severe left and moderate to severe right foraminal stenoses for the emerging C6 nerves.

C6-7: Uncovertebral disc osteophyte complexes more pronounced on the left where there is a paracentral/foraminal disc protrusion. Severe bilateral foraminal stenoses for the emerging C7 nerves. Mild canal stenosis. Facets intact.

C7-T1: No significant canal or foraminal stenosis. Facets intact.
