PROCEDURE:

- Operative Laparoscopy, resection of pelvic wall endometriosis, hysteroscopy, D&C, Mirena Insertion, bilateral oophoropexy

Maria had surgery today under my care at Epworth Freemasons. She has had a long and challenging history of pelvic pain with associated nausea and gastrointestinal issues. The cause of pain has never been established but today at laparoscopic evaluation we were able to identify clear plaques in the pelvis that were entirely consistent with endometriosis. Maria was diagnosed with Endometriosis and there was evidence of superficial peritoneal lesions and an area of deep infiltrating endometriosis. These involved particularly the uterosacral ligaments, pelvic sidewalls, ovaries, and the right fallopian tube. With careful but limited dissection the uterers on both sides of the pelvis we were able to carefully remove the associated plaques. Surgery concluded with a drain in situ. Oophoropexy undertaken just prior to inserting the drain to limit the risk of local adhesion formation in the pelvis.

Mirena installed following inspection with hysteroscopy. The strings were cut 2-3 cm. I will review her back the rooms in eight weeks or so.

1. Curettings 2. Right uterosacral ligament 3. Right pararectal fossa 4. Left pelvic sidewall

MACROSCOPIC DESCRIPTION:

SPECIMEN 1: Labelled: Curettings. A small quantity of red-tan and haemorrhagic tissue. X-1A

SPECIMEN 2: Labelled: Right uterosacral ligament. Four tan firm fragments ranging from 4 to 15 mm in greatest dimensions. 10TS-2A

SPECIMEN 3: Labelled: Right pararectal fossa. Two fibrofatty fragments 10 and 13 mm in greatest dimensions. Both processed whole. 2-1A.

SPECIMEN 4: Labelled: Left pelvic sidewall multiple tan firm fragments ranging from 8 to 12 mm in greatest dimensions. 10TS-2A. RQ

MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION:

SPECIMEN 1: The sections show late secretory phase endometrium. There are abundant neutrophils, there are some stromal breakdown and condensation. There is no hyperplasia or malignancy.

SPECIMEN 2: The sections show fibroadipose tissue with foci of stromal endometriosis. There is no evidence of malignancy.

SPECIMEN 3: The sections show fibroadipose tissue with scattered foci of stromal endometriosis. There is no evidence of malignancy.

SPECIMEN 4: Multiple levels have been examined. The sections show unremarkable fibroadipose tissue. There is no evidence of malignancy.

CONCLUSION:

SPECIMEN 1: CURETTINGS - MENSTRUAL PHASE ENDOMETRIUM.

SPECIMENS 2 AND 3: RIGHT UTEROSACRAL LIGAMENT AND RIGHT PARARECTAL FOSSA, SOFT TISSUE EXCISION-STROMAL ENDOMETRIOSIS.

SPECIMEN 4: LEFT PELVIC SIDEWALL - UNREMARKABLE FIBROADIPOSE TISSUE.
