Anti-Gliadin IgG refers to Deaminated Gliadin Peptide IgG Antibody.

Please note: From 10 November 2015, the coeliac screening panel has changed, and now includes transglutaminase IgA antibody and IgG deaminated gliadin peptide. This panel has a high sensitivity to coeliac disease and eliminates the need to test for total IgA levels. Elevated levels of either of these antibodies has a high specificity for coeliac disease, but diagnosis should always be confirmed by small bowel biopsy. Furthermore, no serological tests demonstrate 100% sensitivity, and where a high index of suspicion of coeliac disease persists and serology is negative, consideration should be given to coeliac gene testing and/or endoscopy and biopsy.
