Elevated vitamin B6 is most likely due to excess consumption. B6 is present in many over the counter preparations (including magnesium supplements) and in energy drinks. B6 > 250 nmol/L is associated with peripheral neuropathy. For patients not consuming excess B6, elevated levels may indicate Hypophosphatasaemia. This condition is rare and patients will have low alkaline phosphatase and high urine phosphoethanolamine. Vitamin B6 was incidentally found to be markedly elevated and was reported free of charge.
