**MRI - RIGHT HIP**

**CLINICAL DETAILS:**

9 month history of significant right hip ache and grabbing anterolaterally. Hip osteoarthritis? Femoroacetabular impingement?

**FINDINGS:**

Comparison with prior MRI right hip from 20/03/2013.

There is a large hip joint effusion with moderate synovitis. No intraarticular bodies.

There is severe osteoarthritis of the right hip joint with high grade chondropathy of more than 75% of the femoral head surface, as well as the acetabulum.

There is a subchondral non-depressed fracture of the central superior femoral head.

There is mucoid degeneration of the labrum with widespread complex tearing.

There is degenerative delamination of the ligamentum teres.

There is enthesopathic changes at the greater trochanter with tendinopathy of the gluteus medius tendon with no focal tear. The gluteus minimus tendon is intact.

There is enthesopathic changes at the pubic tubercle with mild tendinopathy of the adductor tendons.

Mild tendinopathy of the hamstring conjoint tendon.

The femoral vessels returns normal flow voids.

The visualised pelvic organs appears unremarkable.

**COMMENT:**

1. *Subchondral fracture of the femoral head with surrounding oedema. Appearances may reflect early osteonecrosis.*
2. *Severe osteoarthritis of the right hip joint.*
3. *Tendinopathy of the gluteus medius, adductor tendons and hamstring conjoint tendons.*
