It was a pleasure for me to see Orida, who as you know saw me in conjunction with her husband over issues possibly related to COVID.

Orida has quite an amazing classic post COVID vaccine syndrome. It is a mix of neurological symptoms of ataxia, pain, and various other symptoms, which you will have documented.

I have together with colleagues in the United States been treating such patients with moderate doses of Ivermectin, with quite a remarkable benefit in about half the patients. Fortunately, it appears that Orida is one of those. Currently, she is using 12mg a day of Ivermectin and is recovering from the relapse she had following ceasing the first course. She will titrate her symptoms against the dose and we have supplied her with Ivermectin cream which you can prescribe, which needs to be used carefully because it is well absorbed and it gets absorbed into fat tissues and releases slowly. You can now also prescribe 2mg tablets of Ivermectin albeit in small numbers. With respect to the cytomegalovirus, she remains IgG and IgM positive and I think given the fact that she has persistent mild-to-moderate abnormalities in liver function with retained synthesis given her normal albumin levels, hopefully she is resolving the episode of acute hepatitis due to cytomegalovirus. That probably occurred because she had immune suppression in relation to the COVID vaccination. That again has been documented, though rarely do you get this type of reactivation syndrome. What is important is that her liver function is monitored and at some stage she has CT and fibrous scanning of the liver to make sure she is not progressing to a more chronic stage. Can I leave that to you.?
