## Prolactin

Prolactin	<b>897 H</b> (<500)	mIU/L
Macroprolactin	Not detected	

### Comments: No evidence of 'macro'prolactin following PEG precipitation.

Mildly elevated prolactin levels may often be seen as a reaction to stress, in renal failure, hypothyroidism and with some drugs. In females, levels may also rise in response to oestrogens, pregnancy, lactation, post menopausally and in polycystic ovary disease. Pituitary tumours may also elevate prolactin.

Suggest repeat testing on at least two other occasions. Patient should avoid stress, nipple stimulation or excitement and collection should be in the morning.

Drugs associated with increased prolactin release are verapamil, methyl dopa, phenothiazines, haloperidol, other antipsychotics, metoclopramide, domperidone.
