

Thyroid Function

The pattern of mildly elevated TSH levels but normal FT3 and FT4 is referred to as subclinical hypothyroidism - the source of the mild elevation of TSH is typically mild thyroid failure, with one implication being the potential for progression to clinical hypothyroidism. Antithyroid antibodies may be detected in up to 80% of individuals with subclinical hypothyroidism.

If you request this within the next 48 hrs whilst the lab still has your sample, we can add this test on to avoid you having to visit the collection centre again.
